4:00 – 5:00	<p>Novel Findings in Atopic Dermatitis: How To Maximize Treatments</p> <p>Atopic dermatitis (AD), a chronic inflammatory, severely itchy skin disease, with an increasing global prevalence affecting at least 10 - 20 % of children but which may persist into adulthood, is believed to be the first step in the "atopic march" resulting in asthma and allergic rhinitis.</p> <p>The phenotype of the disease is viewed as the result of the interaction between environmental factors, defective skin barrier function and susceptibility genes resulting in immunological and distal neurological abnormalities.</p> <p>The enormous progress in our understanding of the complex pathophysiology of AD, as well as our better knowledge of the structure of the barrier function of the skin and of the role of patient therapeutic education, have ultimately allowed the development of novel therapeutic strategies.</p>
